Those who take the Readers are requested to contribute \$5. Checks should be made to AUMC, "Upper Room Reader" in the note line.

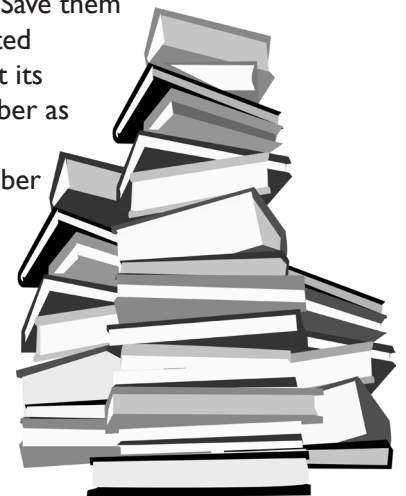
The Annandale CROP Hunger Walk

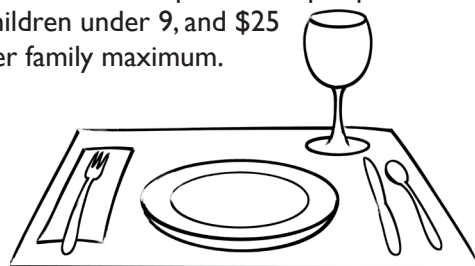
