MAGNIFY AND REJOICE

*"My soul magnifies the Lord, and
my spirit rejoices in God my Savior..."*

- Luke 1:46-47

I have been told that the measure of a truly great sermon is how well people remember it. By that measure, one of my most beloved sermons at AUMC was titled, "There's Something About Mary." Delivered during Advent 2008 (...perhaps it's time to reprise it?), the sermon compared Catholic and Protestant views on Mary, the mother of Jesus. On the one hand, Catholics revere Mary as the Theotokos, or God-bearer. They pray to her, have feast days to commemorate her, and have beautiful iconography to honor her role in salvation history. Protestants, in an expression of disagreement, went too far to the other extreme and have practically ignored Mary altogether. In the Protestant liturgical calendar, Mary is relegated to one Sunday a year (the fourth Sunday in Advent), and otherwise portrayed only in a Christmas pageant or mentioned on Good Friday. In my sermon, I offered a middle path: Mary is as worthy of our attention, study, and honor as any other biblical figure, from the patriarchs to the apostles, and perhaps more so. By preaching, studying, and meditating on the life of Mary, we just might learn her role in Christian history, follow her example of servanthood, and be elevated by her worship of God.

This year's Advent Study gives us the opportunity to do just that. The Academy of Discipleship is pleased to offer Advent Study 2015 - *Not a Silent Night: Mary Looks Back to Bethlehem* by Adam Hamilton. This book invites readers to imagine Jesus from Mary's point of view. In an unorthodox approach, *Not a Silent Night* begins at the end, with Mary's later life, then at the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus; then through Jesus' life and ministry, and ends at the beginning, with the Christ child born in a stable.

The Advent sermon series begins on November 29. The following classes are participating in Advent Study 2015:

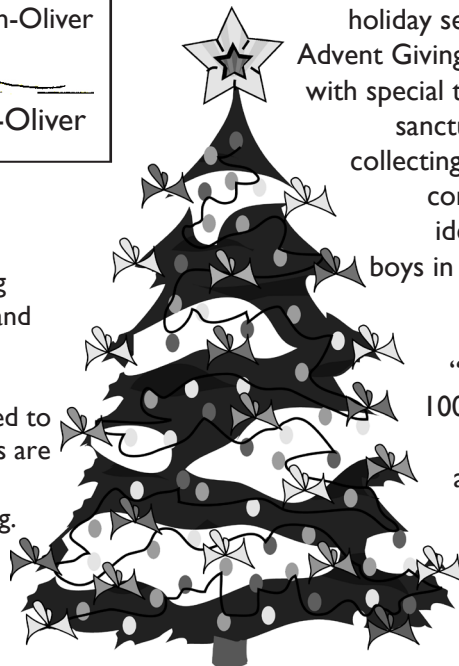
